





Student support

If you need support with progress throughout your course (including finding a placement) or other personal issues, we have a student services officer who can help or direct you to the most appropriate.

Trainers and Assessors

Trainers are available for questions and additional help offered at the end of class. Assessments submitted will be marked by the trainer according to the marking guidelines. Your trainer will provide feedback on your assessments at your next session or, if face to face classes have finished, via phone call or email.

Dedicated Placement Coordinator

Our Placement Coordinator, will work closely with you to offer assistance in finding placement, if required. Whilst we cannot promise to find you placement, we pride ourselves on offering as much support as possible with this process.

One on One student support bookings

One on one sessions are available with your direct trainer if extra assistance is required. Students can also request to repeat a classroom session and MCFE offers open reflection classes run by trainers at each location. MCFE can offer support to students who need additional language, literacy or numeracy support. These services can vary depending on individual student requirements.

Administration Team

The administration team located at our Head Office are available from Monday – Friday from 9:00am – 4:00pm (public holiday excluded) for any queries you may have in relation to their class or course. The team are always willing to assist as much as we can.





Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) and Credit Transfer (CT)

You can ask for your relevant existing skills, qualifications and experiences to be assessed and taken into account when your level of competency is being evaluated. There will be a cost associated, refer to the statement of fees and charges.

If you have previously completed a unit with the same code in your new course, you will be eligible for a credit transfer and you will not have to repeat that unit. There is no cost associated with this process.

Application Process

The following are the basic steps involved in lodging your application for an International course with MCFE.

- 1. Complete the online <u>enquiry form</u> or enquire with your agent
- 2. MCFE will email you an Enrolment Application Form for your selected course(s)
- 3. Read the International Student Handbook and course brochure in detail
- 4. You complete this enrolment form and attach ALL required evidence
- 5. MCFE reviews the application and if successful will invite you to participate in an online interview (10 mins)
- 6. MCFE accepts enrolment applications and will send you a Letter of Offer to sign
- 7. You will make the initial payment 25% of the first course fees + the application fee \$150
- 8. Confirmation of Enrolment (COE) issued to you
- 9. You submit for Visa application
- 10. When approved we will send you pre-course information
- 11. Arrive in Australia attend our Orientation session
- 12. Start your course
