What is a Traineeship?

Traineeships combine training and employment, leading to skills and qualifications that are recognised across Australia.

You will complete your qualification whilst employed, your employer will provide you time to complete your qualification during paid work hours.

Financial Support & Incentives for the Trainee

Eligible Australian Apprentices can claim up to four six-monthly payments over the first two years of the Australian Apprenticeship according to the following schedule and rates (further criteria will apply):

Full time: 6 months = \$1,750, 12 months = \$1,750, 18 months = \$750, 24 months = \$750 Part-time: 6 months = \$875, 12 months = \$875, 18 months = \$375, 24 months = \$375

Structured Training Withdrawal Tasks (STWTs)

You will be withdrawn from routine work activies a nominal amount of hours per week based on your type of employment. Generally 3 hours per week if full-time.

During this withdrawal time you will complete formal theory sessions with MCFE, learning tasks in your workplace and complete your assigned assessment tasks.

You will need to log ALL withdrawal dates, hours and tasks and have your employer sign these off monthly. We will contact your employer monthly for this.

Progress Meetings & Visits

At least 4 times a year your MCFE trainer & assessor will meet with you the trainee and your employer together to discuss your progress towards completing the qualifications. This meeting will often co-incide with your structured workplace observations/assessment visit.

In this meeting all parties must be present and we will go through your task/assessment submission, attendnace and overall progress toward your training plan. Its a chance to ask for help, seek further direction and customise your training plan if required.

Who is involved in a traineeship?

There are 4 main stakeholders involved in a traineeships:

- 1. Trainee
- 2. Employer
- 3. Apprentice Connect Australia Provider (ACAP)
 - a. ACAP's are contracted by the Commonwealth Government to administer the Australian Apprenticeships program and:
 - b. Provide information and advice to employers and other interested parties regarding qualifications, delivery of training and funding available
 - c. Link Employers with appropriate Registered Training Organisations (RTO's)
 - d. Register the National Training Contract with State Training Services e. Manage Incentives to employers and traiees
- 4. Registered Training Organisation MCFE & your trainer & assessor

Entry requirements for traineeships

- Be employed in a part-time or full-time capacity
- Be registered with your employer and the Australian Apprenticeship Support provider as a "Trainee"
- Be an Australian citizen or resident
- Not have previously completed a traineeship or apprenticeship, other qualifications you have recently completed, or have enrolled in could affect eligility
- Other specific criteria may apply check with your Apprentice Connect Australia Provider
- MCFE can commence your training when you receive your official trainee registration number, called an Epsilon Number
- Access to a computer with a camera, microphone and the internet
- Digital skills to participate in online theory sessions, complete assessments online and conduct research via the internet
- Meet current industry vaccination requirements

Financial Support & Incentives for the Employer

You and your employer could access financial support whilst undertaking your traineeship/apprenticeship. Available support will be dependent on the type of traineeship, qualification being undertaken and your personal circumstances. Your Apprentice Connect Australia Provider will provide current information and eligiblity.

<u>Priority hiring incentive</u> (Certificate III and Diploma of ECEC are priority qualifications) A payment for employers of Australian Apprentices training towards an occupation and qualification on the priority list.

You may be eligible to receive a Priority Hiring Incentive of up to \$5000 in the first year of an apprenticeship, paid over two instalments of:

- \$2,000 at 6 months and \$3,000 at 12 months (full-time)
- \$1,000 at 6 months and \$1,500 at 12 months (part-time)

The Priority Wage Subsidy is a wage subsidy for employers of Australian Apprentices training towards an occupation listed on the priorty list. You may be eligible to receive:

- 10% of your apprentices wages paid to you for the first 24 months (up to \$1500 per quarter)
- 5% of your apprentices wages paid to you for the third 12 month period (up to \$750 per quarter)

Course overview

Start a purposeful career working with children! This qualification reflects the role of educators in early childhood education and care who support children's wellbeing, and development in the context of an approved learning framework. Students will learn how to use organisational policies, procedures and individual children's profiles to conduct activities and provide care to children; facilitating their leisure and play and enabling them to achieve their developmental outcomes in an inclusive way.

Job outcomes include; educator, recreation assistant, playgroup supervisor, kindergarten assistant.

Education and Care

Course overview

This qualification reflects the role of educators in early childhood education and care who work in regulated children's education and care services in Australia. Educators at this level are responsible for designing and implementing curriculum that meets the requirements of an approved learning framework and for maintaining compliance in other areas of service operations.

Our course is designed to train students in advanced skills like leadership, health and safety management, developing curriculum and implementing programs for children including those with additional needs. Crucially you'll learn how to ensure a facility follows the regulations of the National Quality Framework. This course has an ideal balance of theory and practical skills to help you build the confidence required to advance in the workplace.

Location

As you are employed when undertaking a traineeship your workplace is your physical training location.



Theory sessions are delivered live online via Zoom and you practical skills and observations will be undertaken in your workplace.

Digital Resources & Digital Skills

All learning content and assessments for this course are conducted via Canvas, our Learning Management System (LMS).

When enrolling in this course, you must have access to the internet and a laptop or desktop computer. If you are undertaking blended training, you will need access to a device with a camera and microphone.

You will need to be able to: navigate the internet easily, use search engines for research, store passwords, file management, use wordprocessing software, complete typed assessments online, and regularly correspond with your trainer online and via email.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) and Credit Transfer (CT)

You can ask for your relevant existing skills, qualifications and experiences to be assessed and taken into account when your level of competency is being evaluated. There will be a cost associated, refer to the statement of fees and charges. If you have previously completed a unit with the same code in your new course, you will be eligible for a credit transfer and you will not have to repeat that unit. There is no cost associated with this process.

Unique Student Identifier (USI)

A USI is your individual education number for life. It also gives you an online record of your VET training undertaken in Australia. If you're at university, TAFE or nationally recognised training, you need a USI. Without one, you can't get Commonwealth financial assistance or your qualification or statement of attainment. Check your eligibility for Skills First Funding

Skills First Funding Eligibility Criteria – Qualifications and Skill Sets

- Evidence of citizenship/residency, you must be:
 - an Australian citizen;
 - a holder of a permanent visa; or
 - a New Zealand citizen
- You can enrol in a maximum of 2 funded qualifications and 2 funded skills sets in one calendar year
- You can undertake up to 2 funded programs at one time
- To access funding, at MCFE we require you to be 17 and over and not enrolled in high school.

Further Information

- Funding rules may differ slightly for courses on the foundation's skills list and apprenticeships.
- You must be physically present in Victoria whilst participating in training and assessment.

Cooling-Off Period

• Your enrolment is reported & confirmed after you attend your second qualification session, and after 24 hours for skill sets.

*This training is delivered with Victorian and Commonwealth Government funding. The course fees depend upon eligibility for a government subsidy, via the Skills First funding program. Funded places are limited, if a funded place is not available you can still enrol as a fee for service student and access a payment plan. Discounts for Fee for Service Students (Not Funded)

If you pay \$1000 up front, you will receive a 25% discount.

Up-front is when fees are paid prior to your first class, and you have signed the direct debit payment plan prior to your course starting.

Enrolment Fee

Enrolment fees will be charged to secure your place in the class. Your enrolment will not be processed until this payment is completed.

Fee Waiver

A fee waiver is when we do NOT charge any government-funded tuition fees, material fees & enrollment fees are still applicable. A fee waiver must be granted in the following scenarios, refer to the website for more information on eligibility for a fee waiver:

- Skills First Aboriginal Access fee waiver'
- Judy Lazarus Transition Centre
- Young people on community-based orders

Concession

If you are entitled to a concession, you will be charged no more than 20% of our standard government-funded tuition fee. Skill sets and programs at the Certificate IV level and below are entitled to a concession.

To be eligible for a concession you must hold a:

- Health Care Card issued by the Commonwealth Government;
- Pensioner Concession Card; or
- Veteran's Gold Card.

A dependant spouse or dependant child of a card holder is also entitled to the Fee Concession.

Further concessions may be granted under the Asylum Seeker VET Program.
